CRITICAL CONVERSATIONS




The ballots have been cast and counted, and Shammas Malik is now Akron's Mayor-elect. But, before he is sworn into office, part of his transition team is already working with AAIC and other interfaith leaders to bring a spectrum of voices to the table for conversations that will lead to action.

The gathering that is set for Sunday, December 3, 2023, at The Remedy Church (1700 Brittain Rd., Akron), is not just for religious leaders. This will be an opportunity for <u>people of faith</u> to focus on issues that affect Akron, and surrounding communities, as a whole. However, it is not just a convenient way for the Mayor-elect to check a box, before moving on to the next thing. This meeting, which is being organized by Round River Consulting, will bring people into the conversation, so that they can compile actionable plans for next steps, that will lead to change.

INTERNATIONAL THANKSGIVING DINNER

Each year, for the last 35 years (except during the COVID-19 shut down) there has been a free Thanksgiving dinner for foreign exchange students at the University of Akron. Recently, it has expanded to include Kent State University foreign exchange students. The event is usually held at St. Bernard's in downtown Akron.

This year, the celebration included a very lively group of students from Latin America which were visiting the U.S. At well over 100 total attendees, it was the largest ever.

Global Ties Akron sponsors the dinner and cooked the turkeys. Members of the community (including AAIC members) bring side dishes, desserts, and meatless entrees.

The objective is to help those far from home to feel at home in Akron, and it provides a great chance to meet students from all over the world who speak excellent English.

This year the program ended with karaoke sung in any language and with up to three mics. The audience danced and cheered and sometimes sang along. In spite of ominous international events, it is still a smaller world than you think.
